Mayor John Tory and Toronto City Councillors:

**EC3.6 Noise By-law Review – Proposed Amendments to Chapter 591, Noise**

We strongly recommend that City Council agree to a two-month deferral on the Noise Bylaw.

Although there are positive changes in the proposed amendments, some amendments appear unworkable. The City has been working on a new noise bylaw since 2015, and the Toronto Noise Coalition has been helping to provide a voice for citizens in this process. The public has had only a week to review very new proposals on this complex matter before the Economic and Community Development meeting, and only two more weeks until the April 16<sup>th</sup> City Council meeting.

It is most important for Toronto to achieve a very good Noise Bylaw. It is especially important for our noise bylaw to protect us from the public health hazard of excessive and unwanted sound. If Toronto City Council agreed on a two-month delay, it would provide additional time for all engaged stakeholders to review and provide input in order to arrive at a new bylaw that would be workable for staff, residents and businesses.
